THE HOLY FAMILY, THE SEED OF
OUR SALVATION IN THE
INCARNATION

“When the fullness of time had come, God sent forth his Son, born of a woman....” (Gal 4:4) brothers.

This word the Lord has addressed to us taken from the Letter of Saint Paul to the Galatians -one of the densest words on the mystery of the Incarnation- helps us to gather together synthetically the various aspects of this singular occasion that we are celebrating. We are therefore at the end of the solar year and have begun the liturgical year with the intersection of two important celebrations, the Christmas which is the birth of Christ and the Holy Mother of God. In which the Madonna, spouse of Joseph and Mother of the Lord, plays a leading role. All this cannot but enrich our hymn of praise today, urging us first of all to pause for meditation filled with grateful wonder, precisely in the interior attitude characteristic of the virgin of Nazareth, who, as the evangelist Luke attests, treasured them in her heart. Holy Family. It talks about family life, in which goodness, humility, mutual forgiveness and peace of heart must be the dominant sentiments: “Above all these, put on love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony” (Colossians 3:14).

We have so much to thank God for, His mercies and grace have been abundant not only on our members but our entire parish. All these give a boost to our hope in Christ who has commissioned us to give life to every living which is dead as a result of hunger and thirst.

For us Catholics, the end of the year should not be lived that worldly euphoria typical of pagans of every age. The last period of the year is an invitation to give thanks to the eternal Father for His gifts and for his wonderful faithfulness, which are manifested in creation, in the succession of times and seasons, but above all in the Redemption, in the fullness of time, when Christ, “eternal son of the Father, was born of the virgin Mother for the salvation of man”, as we are about to sing in the Te Deum.

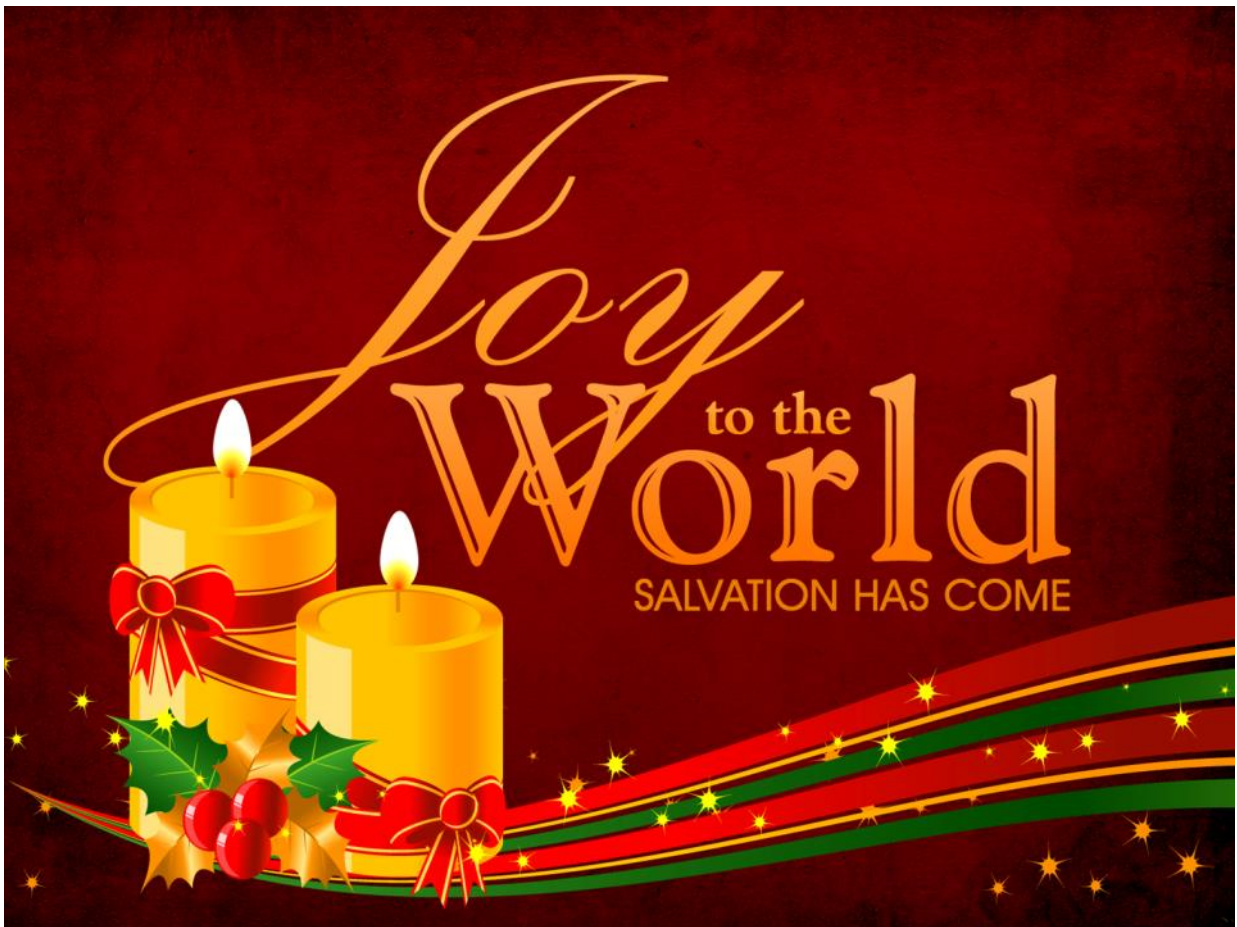

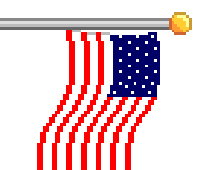
